In 2016-17, LMU undergrads had the option to attend semester-length study abroad programs in 23 different countries.

However, 90% of the 328 students who studied in these programs in 2016-17 did so in these countries...



A more diverse segment of the world hosted LMU undergrads (448 total) through immersion trips (summer or shorter).

Only 2 of 21 countries hosted fewer than 10 LMU students.






